Throughout our jubilee year, a televised Mass will come to you each Sunday on the community television channel (Edmundston, Restigouche, Grand Falls), from one of the 33 parishes of our diocese. On December 3, Mass presided by Father Rino Albert and animated by a group of young people of Edmundston was taped at Notre-Dame-du-Sacré-Coeur Church. On December 11, the Mass inaugurating the opening of our holy year will be televised from the Cathedral. On December 18, Mass will be televised from Assumption Church in Grand Falls. as you can see, it is a modest project, but it will allow us to recognise on the television screen the Christian communities of our Diocese, from Perth-Andover to Connors, and from St-Leonard to St-Jean-Baptiste, whether they be francophone, anglophone, or Maliseet. It is a vibrant project: it is up to us to experience it on a weekly basis.

OUR DIOCESAN SHRINE NEEDS RESTORING

The current condition of our diocesan shrine requires as much courage, boldness, and solidarity as was required of its generous builders back in the 1920s. It behooves us to take up the present challenges and continue to guarantee a bright future to all those who will go on pilgrimage there and pray to St. Ann. Following

the example of our predecessors who made great sacrifices during a trying financial period, in order to build the church, we are invited to do our bit to preserve and restore this precious heritage.

After having consulted with the Diocesan Council of Economic Affairs, I gladly authorise a diocesan drive to be made by mail in December, 1994, a drive initiated by the parishioners of Ste-Anne parish through their Finance Committee and its Parish Pastoral Council, and encouraged by their devoted pastor, Father Gaétan Côté.


Despite the difficult times of economic recession, I hope that all in the Diocese will contribute to this outstanding diocesan ministry according to their means.

THE 1994 ROMAN SYNOD

Throughout October we were kept abreast of the happenings at the World Synod of Bishops in Rome, on the consecrated life. We had been preparing and praying for this for several months beforehand. It is truly a privilege for us to have the opportunity to welcome in our midst one of the participants in this Church event. And I am pleased to invite you to join the religious of the Diocese at the Hôtel-Dieu of St-Basile on Saturday, December 10, from 9:30 AM to 12:00 noon to hear Sister Gilberte Baril, O.P., a Dominican Missionary Sister from Beauport, Québec, who will talk to us about her experiences in Rome as a member of the Canadian delegation to the Synod. Sister Gilberte was one of the 'adjuutores' [resource persons] invited by the Holy Father; her noteworthy intervention dealt with "The Femininity of the People of God and the Consecrated Life of Women." During this our jubilee year, it is important to recognise the extraordinary contribution of the religious men and women, in the founding of our Diocese, in its life and vitality. Even now, though in smaller numbers, the 158 religious men and women from 12 religious congregations, societies of apostolic life, and secular institutes whom we are pleased to have among us, remind us of the fundamental dimensions of our baptismal life: an earnest daily prayer life, apostolic work among the most needy, with the sick, the youth and children, the handicapped, and among priests and future priests, in the fields of education and pastoral training of competent ministers of the Gospel. They remind us daily that we have the mission of deepening our knowledge of the Gospel which was handed down to us as an inheritance, which we must share and acclaim with our brothers and sisters.
