
KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS



There were more than 600 of them attending the Knights of Columbus State Convention that took place in Edmundston on May 20 to 22. Bishop Gérard Dionne, the State Chaplain, was with them throughout, and he addressed them on a number of occasions, especially at the Sunday Mass celebration. I was pleased to welcome the group at the cathedral on Saturday evening, when I told them that "Thirty years ago this year, at the time I was just ordained, I had the honour of being received Knight of Columbus. I have found in our brother knights a boundless sense of availability, a desire to serve the Church, constant regard for the Church's needs, especially regarding priestly vocations, and generous support of pastoral projects. I hope with all my heart that you continue in this happy tradition. Our young diocese is but fifty years old, but already in 1944 - at which time the actual State Chaplain was only a seminarian! - Mgr. W.J. Conway Council N°. 1932 had been in existence for 25 years.

"The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I have said to you' (Jn. 14:26). May this verse from the Gospel for the Fifth Sunday after Easter incite you, Brother Knights, to remember everything that the Risen Jesus accomplished during his mission on earth, which he desires to continue today with each one of you who have become his members through Baptism and who desire to collaborate with him in building up the Kingdom of God. You who were confirmed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, remember always the precious and marvellous gifts you have received. It isn't a spirit of fear, but one of strength and fearlessness. May this State Congress really help you experience the faith, hope, and love of our beloved Church. May you proclaim with Mary, the Immaculate Conception: *'His love is from age to age.'*"

FIRST RECONCILIATION, FIRST COMMUNION

I was really touched by the evaluation which some parents and catechists made regarding the celebration of the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion. For the most part, this period of preparation was quality time spent between parents and children. Parents did not skimp on time taken to participate in these preparations, and found much pleasure in it; they even learned much, from all these meetings. There was a good participation on the part of parents, an excellent programme, interesting and nicely illustrated manuals, timely information, good parish committees... these are a few things I picked up from the evaluations. The celebration of these two sacraments is a spiritual experience of God revealed in Jesus Christ. The two texts used were very appreciated: this is a great example of what can be carried out where there is collaboration between the parish and the school: A community concerned with the little ones invests a lot for the life of the Church. To learn at an early age about forgiveness and friendship in Jesus is an important step taken along the road to holiness, and this, from an early age.

On Saturday, May 27, the Moto Tourism Association asked me to bless their motorcycles. I gladly responded to their invitation, since "There is nothing truly human which does not have a place in the heart of Christ's disciples." Last summer a whole youth network was established throughout the diocese; they are true to their word, and it will benefit both them and the Church as a whole.
