NOTRE-DAME-DU-SACRÉ-COEUR CHURCH

This week the Diocesan Council for Economic Affairs, the Diocesan Council for Pastoral Ministry, and the Priests' Senate held their regular meetings. I took that occasion to ask their advice regarding the offer made by the city of Edmundston to purchase the Notre-Dame-du-Sacré-Coeur Church building. The committees and Priests' Senate recommended that before giving their recommendations on the matter, the Notre-Dame-du-Sacré-Coeur parishioners have a chance to bring forth their own suggestions in the ensuing weeks regarding what they plan to do to ensure the continuation of their parish. The next Diocesan Committee for Economic Affairs meeting is scheduled for May 20, and the Priests' Senate meeting will take place May 23.

PRIESTS' RETREAT

I am pleased to invite the priests of our diocese to take part in the annual retreat that is to be held at the Diocesan Centre from Monday, April 28, to Friday, May 2. The retreat will be facilitated by Father Claude Michaud. In his Apostolic Exhortation on Priestly Formation, Pope John Paul II writes: « If any time is a favourable time for the Holy Spirit to help the priest grow in prayer, study, and awareness of his pastoral duties, there are nonetheless special periods for this, even when these periods have are customary been and planned in advance. First there are those meetings of the bishop with his presbyterium, [His clergy] whether these meetings are liturgical, pastoral, or cultural. There are also meetings on priestly spirituality such as spiritual exercises, and days of recollection and spirituality. These are occasions for spiritual and pastoral growth, for a calmer and more prolonged prayer time, for a return to our priestly roots, for a fresher approach to the motives inspiring fidelity and pastoral vitality. » All the priests are expected at the Diocesan Centre on Monday, April 28, by 4:00 P.M. Following supper, there will be a eucharistic celebration marking the beginning of the period of silence until Friday at noon. Like last year, there will be continuous adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the Bishop's Chapel (on Monday, from 7:00 to 9:00 P.M., and on the other days from 8:00 A.M. to 9:00 P.M.). On Friday, May 2, we shall mark at both the Mass and the meal following, the following ordination anniversaries: the 60th anniversary of Father Yvon Sirois, the 45 years of Msgr. Eymard Desjardins and Fr. Alfred Ouellet, the 40 years of ordination of Fr. Lucien Lévesque and Fr. Joseph Moisan, the 35 years of Fathers Lewis Long, Almer Levasseur, and Bertrand Ouellet, the 25 years of Fr. Frédéric Poitras, the 20th anniversary of Fr. William Rice, the 15th anniversary of Fr. Pierre Thibodeau, and the 10th anniversary of Fr. Yvon Samson.

THE MSGR. JOSEPH-AURÈLE PLOURDE COUNCIL

The St. Quentin Knights of Columbus will shortly be celebrating their golden anniversary, and on that occasion their council will take the name of Archbishop Joseph-Aurèle Plourde who was assistant pastor in that parish and was the first priest from our diocese to become bishop (1964).
